Music is taught for one hour each week in KS1 and KS2 by Alanna Devereaux, a class teacher with a specialism in Music.

We also hold a whole-school singing assembly once every other week for 30 minutes, where we learn songs that reflect our school values as well as songs for performances throughout the year.

Children have the opportunity to learn instruments as part of whole-class tuition, with instruments provided by the Devon Music Education Hub.

Extra Curricular Music Activities

Further to this, we have a visiting peripatetic teacher once a week, who offers individual and small group lessons in school. These lessons are funded by parents.

We have a school choir during the Autumn Term, who have the opportunity to perform at the Christmas Performance.

Music Events

Children are given opportunities to perform at various musical events in school, including the Harvest Festival, Christmas performances, and the Easter Service. On these occasions, children perform for parents, carers, and the wider community.

Previous high-quality musical experiences have included a *Harry Potter* Musical Workshop with the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra and a String Trio performance during a whole-school assembly.
