Snacks:

Please be aware that pupils in Butterflies and Foxes class receive free fruit and vegetable snacks as part of a government funded scheme. Unfortunately, we are unable to offer this to key stage 2 pupils. Buzzards and Stags are welcome to bring in their own snacks for breaktime, however, we ask that you please ensure these snacks are of the fruit or vegetable variety.

An increasing number of children are not bringing in their water bottles. Please ensure your child has their water bottle daily.

STAGS:

In Stags Class this month, we finished writing our own examples of Animalium and have moved into looking at Wallace and Gromit's Cracking Contraptions – we have particularly enjoyed watching the clips and laughing along to the crazy ideas they have.

In Maths, Year 5 have finished working on fractions, decimals and percentages and Year 6 have been working on Ratio. Some children have been working in groups with Mrs Palmer to build their confidence in long multiplication and this has been a great success.

In Science, we completed our work on Separating Materials and carried out numerous experiments to find the best way to sieve, filter and hand separate a range of mixtures – sand and water, ping pong ball and water. Stags love getting stuck in and predicting the most efficient ways.

Topic saw us finish the Stone Age to the Iron Age and the class wrote 'mini essays' in response to the question "How did life change from the Stone Age to the Iron Age?". I've added some examples of work to show off their amazing knowledge. On Class Dojo there is an optional homework menu of different, fun activities children can complete if they fancy a creative challenge.

In RE, we looked at and finished learning about Islam and the class created some wonderful leaflets to show off their learning. Our websites will include different pages by the end of today and we can talk about different places in our town in French! 'Simon says', or should I say 'Jaques a dit' is a game that we have enjoyed playing to learn different directions.



We look forward to seeing what March has to bring!

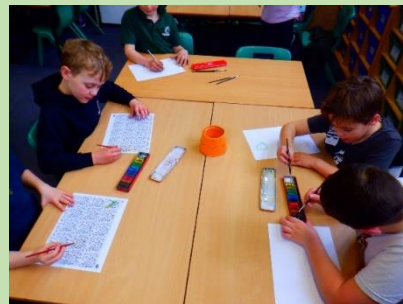


BUZZARDS:

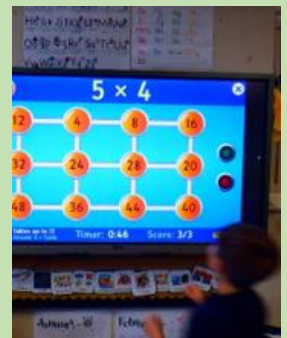
What a great month! It started in such a positive way with the whole of Buzzards class winning the community award. We then had our Forest Friday, which everyone thoroughly enjoyed.

BUTTERFLIES:

Following on from our trip to the zoo last month, we have been learning about the classification of animals and food chains. Butterflies Class were able to create their own food chains, using arrows to show the passing of energy from producer, to prey, to predator.

In Maths, year 1 have been looking at numbers to 50, using resources to make the tens and ones in two-digit numbers. Year 2 have been looking at some of their times tables, finding "pairs" in their 2 times table. We have also learnt about odd and even numbers and how to spot them.

In English, we have been learning about "How to Hide a Lion at School." In the story, the lion hides on a school trip and we will be using our Exmoor Zoo trip as inspiration for our writing. Butterflies Class have been fantastic at remembering their actions in our story map and have produced their best writing yet!

In Gymnastics, we have been building up to doing handstands by practicing key shapes at different heights. Butterflies Class have really enjoyed spending their PE sessions in the hall with different apparatus and have made great progress.

The children in Foxes class have enjoyed exploring different kinds of forces, pushing and pulling toys, investigating which objects are magnetic as well as making some fantastic pictures by blowing the paint around the paper.



In maths this week they have learnt about length and height, using the correct vocabulary to compare how far they could walk on stilts and sorting objects, including themselves, by height.



Continuing their exploration of churches, the reception children made some beautiful stained-glass windows. We now need some sunshine to show them to their full effect!



Before half term the children loved learning about Chinese New Year, especially trying to using chopsticks as well as making great dragon pictures and lanterns. Drawing club is as popular as ever.
