Holidays in term time cannot be authorised and you will be informed of this if you make a holiday request. Breakfast Club

If you would like to book your child into breakfast club please e-mail: admin@filleigh-primary.devon.sch.uk.

Breakfast will be included for children arriving before **8.20am**. The Club is based in the small room next to Buzzards and activities and games will be provided. The main gates at the top of the school will be open to allow access to the club only from **7.50am**. If you arrive after **8.40am** you will not be able to join breakfast club as the children are taken to their classes at that time.

The price is **£2.50 per session**, including breakfast for those arriving early, **and is payable on the ParentMail system**.

• Parents will need to book places for their children to attend the club in advance by e-mailing Mrs Smith.

- If you have booked a place and do not turn up **you will be charged** cases of illness will be considered on an individual basis.
- If your child is unwell that morning and cannot make Breakfast Club, please could you ring or text the school mobile on 07833 648724 to let them know.
- If you want to bring your child to breakfast club on that morning **you must call the school mobile** on 07833 648724 to ask if there is space.

Reporting Absence:

When your child is absent from school you MUST contact the school to inform us that your child will be absent, the reason for their absence and their expected return date to school.

If you do not inform us by 9.30am it is our duty of care to start calling the next of kin and work through the contacts list. As you can imagine this is quite a time-consuming job.

Please ensure you report your child absent by phoning, e-mailing or the quickest and easiest way is on the ParentMail app.



Our year 6's have been lucky enough to have had a block of Forest School with Mrs. Kent Smith, which has now come to an end. As a result, the year 5's have begun their block, and feedback I am receiving is all positive!

We have also now finished our block of coaching with Exeter City Football Academy, and the

children have learned various different games and alternatives to football, as well as how to keep themselves healthy, and eat a balanced diet! 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We have been learning about the UK and its countries and regions. Part of our learning has involved finding the different counties and main cities in the UK. We have used maps to study topographical features and researched the higher

cities in the UK. We have used maps to study topographical features and researched the highest peaks in England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland. We have also created our own maps using compasses, keys and four figure grid references.





In our PSHE we have been learning about how we can live healthily. The lessons have investigated how we can make safer choices about sleep and exercise, diet, cleanliness and substances.

BUTTERFLIES:

Butterflies Class have been working incredibly hard this month and have coped well with changes in adults. Butterflies have started to look a multiplication and division in Maths and have begun practicing their 2- and 3-times tables. Can you find things around your house that come in pairs or trios?

In Writing, we have started looking at a new text - "What do you do with a tail like this?" This is a nonfiction text all about different animals and how their tails, noses and eyes are adapted to help them do special jobs. The children will be writing their own textbook-style extracts about their favourite animals. This text also fits nicely alongside our science topic, where we are looking at living creatures and their habitats. We will also be looking at animal adaptations during Science Week next month. What is your favourite animal and what can it do that is special? Think about where it might live and why.

In Topic, we have started to learn about king and queens of the past. We will be moving onto learn about castles and their different parts. Have you every been to a castle? What can you remember about it?
